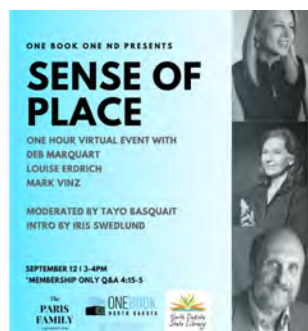


Sense of Place

NDSL Kit of the Month

As of July 1, STEM and Display kits are again available from the State Library for checkout by libraries. Kits are a popular program at libraries of all types; today we will highlight Q-BA-MAZE 2.0 Mega Stunt Set.

This kit is a unique system of colorful, interlockable cubes to create marble runs. Users will create maze sculptures while developing critical thinking skills, hand-eye coordination, and spatial reasoning. Q-BA-MAZE strengthens understanding of physics, basic engineering, strategy, and fine motor skills while fostering creativity, collaboration, and logical thinking.

This kit is designed for ages 6+ but can be enjoyed by adults as well as children. No device is needed.

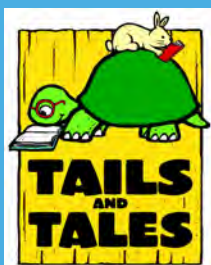

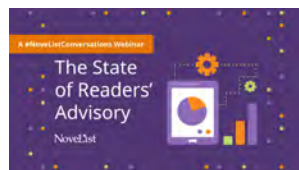
