The North Dakota State Library is excited to announce that kits are now available to be checked out by anyone with a library card from the State Library.





Each year, a massive celebration and military parade take place in Rome, while ceremonies, speeches, concerts, and parades take place across the country.

Juneteenth, also called Emancipation Day or Juneteenth Independence Day, is a holiday commemorating the end of slavery in the United States, observed annually on June 19. Although President Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863, it was not until June 19, 1865, that this news reached slaves in Galveston, Texas. One year later, the first official Juneteenth celebration occurred in Texas. Since then, this event has




spread across the United States, and all states (and the District of Columbia) view Juneteenth as a state holiday or observance.

World Refugee Day

June honors a few major celebrations including Juneteenth (check out NDSL's LibGuide <u>here</u>), Pride Month (LibGuide <u>here</u>), and Father's Day. This article focuses on another observation: World Refugee Day.



World Refugee Day is celebrated annually on June 20th. This day shines a light on the needs and rights of

refugees, as well as encourages them to thrive in their new homes. In December 2000, the United Nations General Assembly recognized the upcoming year (2001) as the 50th Anniversary of the <u>1951 Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees</u>. The UN decided to designate this 2001 anniversary as the first World Refugee Day (Calendarr, n.d.; United Nations High, n.d.).

An average of 42,500 people flee their homes seeking asylum, or safety, in other countries every day. Approximately half of these individuals are children under the age of 18 (Calendarr, n.d.). Many of these persons leave with little notice and few possessions.




Pride Month LibGuide
